Research Bursary Awards 2011/2012 Call for Proposals

The statutory remit of the Road Safety Authority encompasses research. In the Road Safety Strategy 2007-2012, the Authority is committed to the development of a long-term research programme, details of which can be found on the RSA website at www.rsa.ie/bursaryawards. The Authority invites proposals for a number of specific PhD/bursary awards for the beginning of the 2011/2012 academic year. The following priority topics are of particular interest:

- better understanding of the factors involved in road crashes;
- development of improved road safety countermeasures;
- identification of best practice in road safety;
- development of evidence-based material for public education activities;
- scientific evaluation of existing road safety measures/programs;
- development of improved road safety research techniques.

The Authority will also accept submissions on topics not on the list above but which are relevant to the development of road safety in Ireland.

The Road Safety Authority invites applications from suitably qualified academic researchers in universities or other equivalent research institutions. The application must be made in conjunction with a third level institution with a proven track record in the selected area(s). The fellowships will be supervised by appropriate experts in the host university/institute and by relevant Road Safety Authority personnel.
