

Overview



-RSA

- As of 31 December 2020, there have been 137 fatal collisions, which have resulted in 148 fatalities on Irish roads.
- This represents eight more fatal collisions and eight more deaths (+6%) compared to provisional Garda data for 2019.


Road User Type

 Driver and passenger fatalities represent almost 6 in 10 fatalities (59%) in 2020.

•There has been an increase in the number of passenger (+11), pedestrian (+5), cyclist (+2), motorcyclist (+1), and other (+1), fatalities in 2020 compared to 2019.


 A decrease in fatalities has been seen among drivers (-12)





Seatbelts: Of the 85 drivers and passengers killed in seatbelt-equipped motor vehicles in 2020, 43 (51%) were wearing a seatbelt at the time of the collision; 26% were not wearing a seatbelt; and for the remaining 20 fatalities, it was not yet known (24%).





Month of Year





- •April (7) and May (6) had the lowest number of fatalities in 2020.
- February (19) and September (18) had the highest number of fatalities.
- •The average number of deaths per month in 2020 was 12.3 deaths per month).






Day of the Week



- Saturday (29) was the most dangerous day in 2020, followed by Monday (25), and Wednesday (25).
- Over half of fatalities in 2020 occurred on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday (53%).
- 43% of fatalities occurred between 12pm and8pm
- There were 25 fatalities between midnight and 6am (17%).
