Almost half (47%) of fatalities between Friday and Sunday



## **Fatalities long-term trend** 1998-2022





- This represents 26 more deaths (+27%) compared to provisional Garda data for the same period in 2022.







## Age group of fatalities 1 January – 29 August





### Summary of 2023 Fatalities 1 January – 29 August

- As of 29 August 2023, there have been 124 fatalities on Irish roads
- This is an average of 16\* fatalities a month
- There is an increasing number of fatalities among passengers and pedestrians

- A quarter of fatalities were aged 16-25 years
- Almost half of fatalities (46%) occurred between 8pm and 8am
- Almost half (47%) of fatalities between Friday and Sunday
- Over half (58%) of fatalities were killed in a single vehicle collision.

Note: Data is provisional and subject to change. Figures from January-29 August used to calculate 2023 monthly average. A single vehicle collision is a collision which involved one vehicle.
