RSA observational study 2015 – helmet use by motorcyclists and pedal cyclists

Research Objective

To determine the incidence of motorcyclists and pedal cyclists helmet wearing.

Methodology

140 urban sites were surveyed. Observations were carried out on weekdays (Monday to Friday) between the hours of 07:00 to 10:00, 12:00 to 15:00 and 17:00 to 20:00. Pedal cyclists were further divided into those using private bicycles and public bicycles (Dublin, Cork, Galway and Limerick). Study conducted by Amárach Research.

Key Findings

- In 2015, 3% of motorcyclists were observed not to be wearing a helmet, an increase of 2% on 2014.
- Between 2014 (41%) and 2015 (52%), helmet wearing rates have increased amongst all pedal cyclists.
- Helmet wearing by private bicycle users has increased to 57% in 2015 from 46% in 2014.
- Helmet wearing by public bicycle users was found to be 27% in 2015. During the 2014 study public bicycles were only available in Dublin (9% helmet wearing).
- Wearing of high visibility clothing was also observed, 56% of all motorcyclists had both a helmet and high visibility clothing, 41% of private pedal cyclists and 13% of public pedal cyclists had both.
