Welcome to the 14th edition of our annual 'Educational news'

As part of the RSA's commitment to bringing road safety to all communities, we run a **Nationwide Road Safety Education Service** where our team of Road Safety Promotion Officers and educators visit locations and present effective programmes that tackle all elements of road safety with an age and demographic approach.

During 2023, over 130,000 people received road safety education in Ireland through our Nationwide Road Safety Education Service. This included 2,896 road safety presentations delivered by our team of Road Safety Promotion Officers to schools, companies, pre-schools, youthreach centres as well as community groups. This service, which began in April 2014, continues to be successful and in high demand.

The **StreetSmart** service which is the RSA's interactive primary school resource continued to be highly sought after with over 10,000 school children 51 schools experiencing road safety lessons in a fun and interactive way. StreetSmart brings road safety to life for young children. Using a pretend streetscape mat and props, children are invited to carry out everyday road safety tasks under the supervision of our Educator Team where the appropriate learnings and skills are taught during the sessions.

The invaluable **'Check it Fits'** service aims to reassure parents, grandparents and guardians that their children are travelling safely in their child car seat and that the seat itself is securely fitted in the car. In 2023, the service conducted 6,039 child car seat checks with 3,759 visitors. During this same period, there were 136 Check it Fits events which included both virtual and in-person. This service was and continues to be free of charge and is available nationwide.

The Road Safety Interactive Unit 'Shuttle' continues to offer fully interactive road safety educational experiences using simulated virtual situations in our virtual reality pods. In 2023, over 49,000 visitors experienced this offering and the unit attended 87 events nationwide.

In 2023, our exciting **Road Safety innovations** continued to be as popular as ever where our road safety games, VR Oculus experiences, and test your car maintenance knowledge resources were well received. Further details on these can be found later in this newsletter.

Beep Beep Day

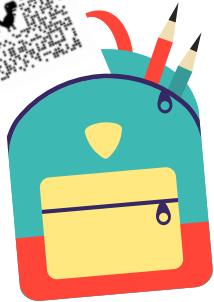
Friday 11, October 2024

This is a national road safety awareness day for young children. It takes place in crèches and Montessori schools around the country during Road Safety Week from 7 to 11 October but can also take place at any other time during the year.

On Beep Beep Day, children aged 5 and under will practise basic road safety skills with the Simon and Friends road safety storybooks, songs, games and activities.

Primary schools



CYCLE RIGHT is the national standard for cycle training and provides practical cycle safety and skills training to promote competent and confident cyclists. The programme is produced and supported by the Department of Transport, Tourism and Sport, the Road Safety Authority and Cycling Ireland, with input from central and local agencies and other groups.

CYCLE RIGHT is delivered over three stages with participants gaining skills and knowledge on a phased basis which prepares the individual to cycle in increasingly complex road scenarios. Ideally, individual sessions in each stage should be delivered at intervals (weekly) to allow sufficient time for practice in between.

Cycle Right Parent and Guardian E-learning which was launched in 2023 will increase your knowledge on cycling with children and supporting them to become safe cyclists:

Topics covered include: Preparing to go cycling – clothing, helmet, bike and conditions checks; Teaching a child to cycle – from the first time on a bike through balance and pedaling to independent cycling; Features of the road environment – situations to be conscious of and how to guide children through them; Turning left and right – the steps to outline to a child in making these essential maneuvers on a bike; Cycling with a child – what position should you, as an adult, take and how can you support a child cycling on the road.

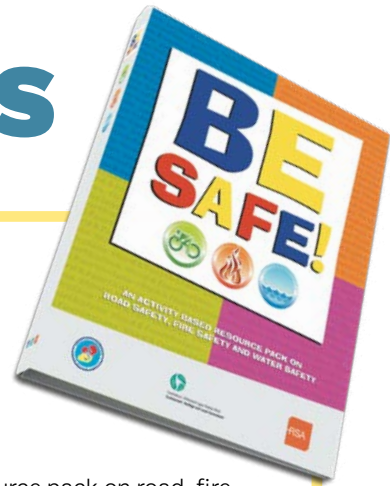

Seatbelt Sheriff is aimed at children in 1st class. The children become Seatbelt Sheriffs by taking a pledge to always wear their safety belt and to make sure that everyone else in the car is buckled up. They are given a certificate, which gives them the power to instruct passengers and drivers to 'Buckle Up' in any vehicle in which they are travelling.

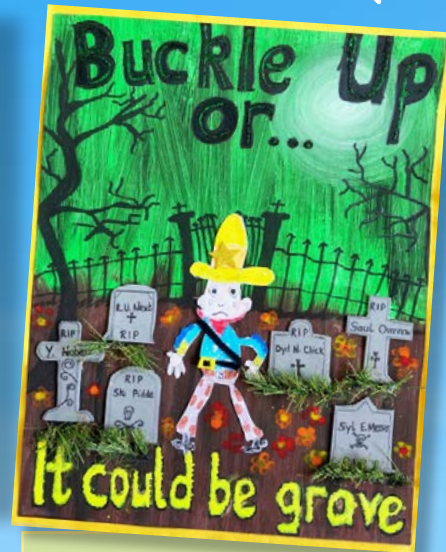

Road Safety Matters

For 12-16-year olds

Road Safety Matters is a teacher-led road safety resource for Junior Cycle students that is interesting, fun and enjoyable for teachers and the students. The resource has been developed to place student wellbeing at the centre of learning. The resource aims to ensure students learn the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to keep themselves and others safe on the roads. The lesson plans are available through the Virtual Learning Environment and many different teachings and learning methodologies are used.

The learning experienced while taking part in this programme will be of use to students in their everyday lives as pedestrians, cyclists, passengers or drivers. It will enhance students' wellbeing throughout their lives and empower students with the necessary skills to be responsible, safe road users.

The programme consists of four strands:

- Strand 1** – Who's who in road safety?
- Strand 2** – Are we roadworthy?
- Strand 3** – Recognising road risk
- Strand 4** – Socially responsible road use

Students will learn:

- About the consequences of risky behaviour
- How to make informed decisions about their own and others welfare
- To become aware of their personal values towards road safety
- How their values affect their behaviours and moral choices
- Of the threats that exist to their personal safety
- How to take steps to protect themselves and to value being healthy and safe
- That they have rights and responsibilities as a road user

For 15-17-year olds

Road Safety Matters is an educational road safety toolkit, designed to support teachers, and Transition Year students. The road safety toolkit has an eclectic mix of resources and updates will be available, as information is updated.

It is a simple step by-step guide in preparing, educating and supporting students as safe road users. It aims to enrich student's understanding of how our roads are shared spaces and how we can prepare and practice to ensure we are all safe road users.

The resource is designed in a concise, easy to follow and an engaging format. It includes a range of activities which will encourage students to apply the theory to road safety and understand the choices available to them.

The resource is divided into 10 achievable units.

Unit 1 – Setting the Scene

Unit 2 – Learning to Drive

Unit 3 – Components of a Car

Unit 4 – Speed

Unit 5 – Alcohol

Unit 6 – Drugs

Unit 7 – Distractions

Unit 10 – Assessment and Celebrations

These are flexible, they can be delivered over a 10 week period or you may opt to deliver it for longer period depending on time and timetabling in transition year.

Remember it's about all road users.



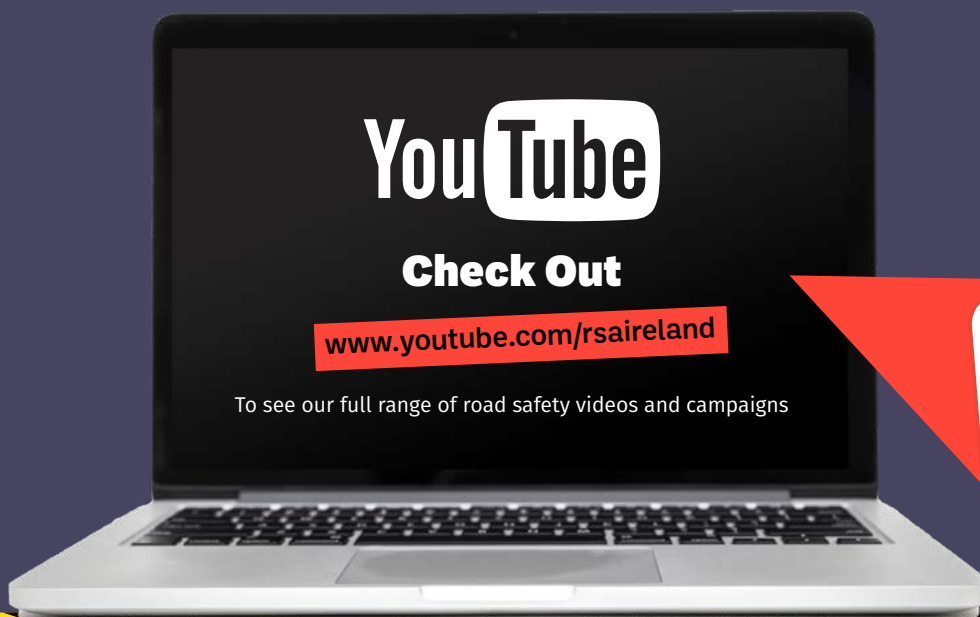

Virtual interactive presentations now available

We run educational campaigns for specific groups within the community based on their particular needs.

Wrecked.ie

For adults aged 17-24

This programme targets young people who are a major risk group on Irish roads and are three times more likely to be killed in a collision than the rest of the population.

Wrecked.ie uses real-life stories to tell the consequences of road traffic collisions and other life-changing events that happen on our roads.

It features a series of vodcasts (video broadcasts) telling real-life stories of reckless road user behaviour. The vodcasts are illustrated with high-tech animation highlighting the key points in each speaker's testimony. These focus on themes such as driver distraction, drug driving, road user impairment, driving without insurance, modified cars and driving when using a mobile phone. This programme can also be given to students in SOLAS and Youthreach training programmes.

The accompanying guide tells you how to start a stimulating group discussion for each story where participants can talk openly about road safety.

We run free 'train the trainer' sessions on how to present this programme through our new Virtual Learning Environment (VLE).

Protecting our community

A call to action

This is a road safety awareness programme for adults based on the Rules of the Road. It consists of a resource pack and DVD. The programme aims to change the attitudes and behaviour of pedestrians, cyclists, motorcyclists and drivers.

Core topics covered include:

- Speed and speeding
- Road user impairment
- Unsafe behaviour towards or by vulnerable road users such as children, older adults, motorcyclists and cyclists
- Safety belts, child restraints and safety on buses
- Emergency services.

Topics are presented as thirty-minute 'session plans', ideal for community groups. They are highly interactive and include lots of activities.

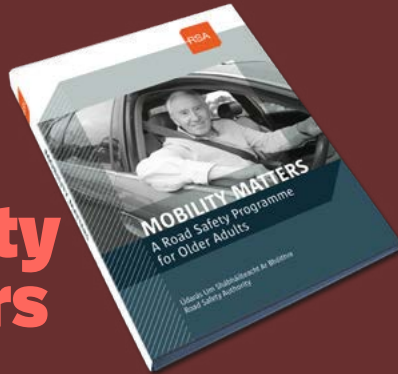

Mobility Matters is a road safety awareness programme for older people.

The programme covers:

It also covers what the law says you must do to protect yourself and other road users.

CYCLE RIGHT

CYCLE RIGHT provides a defined standard of training in Ireland for both adults and children.

- Participants will be offered the skills to cycle confidently on the road network, from novice to competent cyclists.
- The programme will be delivered over three stages with participants gaining skills and knowledge on a phased basis, preparing them to cycle in increasingly complex road scenarios.
- All **CYCLE RIGHT** training is delivered by registered trainers.
- A new digital hazard perception resource has been added to the programme supported by the RSA, to help participants recognise and respond to hazards on the road.

Cycle Right ELearning Adult Training Resource

This is a new support for adult cyclists in navigating traffic and the road system. It features a unique perspective on the road environment as seen from a cycling point of view.

The resource will bring cyclists through the essentials of being ready to cycle, cycling with others, positioning on the road, road structure, visibility and perception, and it will allow them then self-test their knowledge.

Structured in modules, the resource is designed to either be completed in sections and re-accessed or completed in one sitting.

'Check it Fits' Service

The RSA 'Check it Fits' Service is a free child car seat checking service. It aims to reassure parents, grandparents and guardians that their children are travelling safely in their child car seat and that the seat itself is securely fitted in the car. The service is available nationwide.

It was introduced in response to the frightening statistic that showed that as many as 4 out of 5 child car seats are incorrectly fitted. This can result in serious or fatal injury to a child in a collision. The service is quick, easy, and available throughout Ireland and can be offered virtually when required. Our experts will help you with any problem you have in installing your child seat. They will also show you how to fit the restraint correctly and answer any queries you may have.

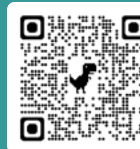


Roscommon natives, Clodagh and Méabh White, were awarded Gertie Shields Supreme Award in road safety for 2023.

This inspiring mother and daughter team were chosen as the overall winners by the judges for their awareness efforts and contribution to road safety since their own personal experience in a car collision in 2016. Both suffered serious injuries when they were in a crash with a larger vehicle. Méabh's little brother, Rian, who was also in the car, escaped uninjured. Rian's rear-facing child seat had been inspected and adjusted by the RSA child car seat checking service - Check it Fits - just days beforehand, and they and his doctors at the time believed that it had saved his life. In addition to their awareness efforts since their horrific experience, they have been advocates of child car seat safety, highlighting the importance of ensuring they are fitted correctly and checked regularly.

The award was presented to Clodagh and Méabh by Minister of State for Transport Jack Chambers at the RSA's Leading Light in Road Safety Awards in the RDS.

Getting children to school safely



Research shows that children under 12 do not have the skills and experience needed to be safe in traffic on their own and should be taken to school by an adult.

Safer parking at the School Gate

Children are the most vulnerable members of our society and we do not want to put a child's life in danger. If you drive your children to school, park carefully to avoid confusing other parents and their children. Thoughtless parking can force children onto the road to get around your car.

Road Safety Promotion Officers are available to deliver road safety talks to parents/guardians.

Checklist for hiring a bus



You can do your bit to make it safer outside school by:

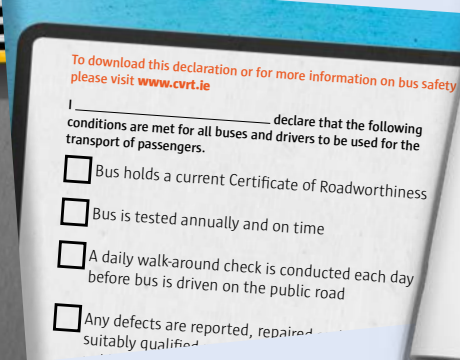
- Driving safely and obeying the speed limits
- Parking so that your child can leave the car on the footpath side away from traffic
- Paying attention to other children at the side and behind your car when parking, dropping off or setting off
- Parking so you don't block the flow of traffic or access (don't double park) for emergency vehicles

Don't:

- Stop or park where there are yellow zig-zag lines along the edge of the road and the words 'SCHOOL KEEP CLEAR'
- Park on any double yellow lines
- Park on a footpath or a cycle track (this is an offence)
- Park in a way that would block the school entrance or exit, residents' driveways or junctions
- Park at bus stops, disabled parking spots or private parking spots
- Park within 15 metres before or 5 metres after a pedestrian crossing or traffic lights

Think about:

- Encouraging your children to walk or cycle to school to increase their physical fitness (it's a good opportunity for you to be more physically active too!)
- Car pooling or taking public transport
- Parking nearby and walking the rest of the way
